


## FOURTEENTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME – YEAR B

4/5 JULY 2009

I am writing this on Wednesday afternoon. On Monday Andy Murray went through to the last eight of Wimbledon, the match having been played under the roof for the first time and with floodlighting. He is due to play later today, and who knows, he may be heading towards being Wimbledon champion by the time we are together for Mass.

Clearly the atmosphere inside the Centre Court was electric and the crowd was quite partisan, and he seemed more popular than ever before, especially among younger people. I hope you have noticed, while he is winning at least, that the commentators are very careful to describe him as British rather than Scottish!

In many ways the reaction to Andy Murray's success is the opposite of what is heard in the Gospel: "A prophet is only despised in his own country, among his own relations and in his own house". But perhaps that's the difference between a prophet and someone who is clearly enjoying success. We all like to be associated with winners and achievement.

The prophet has the task of telling the truth, no matter how unpalatable it may be; or of encouraging a change in behaviour and attitude so that the word of God is respected, and the love of God is shown to all. A prophet isn't simply someone who goes around making life difficult for the sake of it, but rather someone whose life and teaching is based in God-given truth.

I do wonder sometimes whether we are living in a time when the Catholic Church has a more prophetic role than it may have done in the immediate past. There was a time when our conviction about the dignity of life and the importance of moral and social conduct was widely shared and accepted. There was a time when our language about the love of God and the fact that Jesus lived and died among us was shared by the majority. These days that is just not the case.

It is clearly pretty easy for young people to identify with the success – so far – of Andy Murray and others like him. It's probably less easy for them to identify with the "success" of the prophetic stance of the Church and some of the teaching that our faith calls us to take up. We need to do all we can to support them and guide them.
