


## Nineteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time - Year A

**9/10 August 2008**

Since I came here some days ago, I have tried to live my faith and at the same time have endeavoured to support and increase the faith of the English Martyrs parish community. Over the last few Sundays we have been progressing through our spiritual journey by the Gospels about the one seed, and that seed is the Father's Son, Jesus Christ. Through prayer and faith we should nurture this seed and allow it to grow within us.

I recently read a newspaper and two of its headlines attracted my attention: the first was "Lord, preserve us from niceness and cleverness" – a criticism of the homily of Bishop Crispian, and the second was, "What Pope Benedict really said at World Youth Day" – a resumé of the preaching by the Pope during his visit in Australia. The first author attempts to be more intellectual than the bishop. The second author says nothing new in his article except for the word "really", which only emphasises the Pope's message. The point is that His Holiness and the Bishop, in their own way, were providing a fertile ground in which the seed can grow in our daily lives.

I would like to invite each of you to reflect. I think that the mission of Pope Benedict, as well as the bishop, is to irrigate our soil for which God has already provided us with the seed to raise a healthy crop. It is not a matter of cleverness. It is more than that. Would you like your seed to be strangled by thorns? Nowadays, such criticisms do not enhance our spiritual growth. Do not allow such words to invade your soul.

The real problem is trying to recognise the thorns and suppress or even eliminate them each day.

### HUMAN FERTILISATION AND EMBRYOLOGY BILL

The government has now postponed until autumn the final stages of the Bill, which will include debate on pro-abortion amendments. Amendments already tabled include:

- Making abortion available on the signature of only one doctor rather than two as at present.
- Allowing nurses and midwives to carry out abortions.
- Abolishing the need for any reason to be given for abortions.
- Extending locations where abortion drugs can be given out to include GP's surgeries, local health centres and school sick rooms.

We should use the next few weeks to write to our MP and the Prime Minister expressing opposition to these moves. Urge them to support any pro-life amendments instead, e.g. the entitlement of women to be given information on the possible physical and psychological effects of abortion.
