


Pentecost Sunday – Year A

10/11 May 2008

For six months, going on seven, our worship has been dominated by three great themes, the Birth of the Saviour (Christmas) with its preparation period of Advent; then we celebrated his Death and Resurrection (Easter) with its preparation period of Lent; for the last seven weeks we have been living in the aftermath of Easter which is a time of preparation for the celebration of Pentecost.

It's a long slog through these next six months to the end of November when the next Advent Season begins. Sunday after Sunday after Sunday we shall be wearing, green vestments. Perhaps for that reason green has come to represent an almost lifeless colour for me!

But it is a heaven sent opportunity. The Advent - Christmas - Lent - Easter – Pentecost cycle has been a time of looking heavenwards, a time of building our hopes, a time for living out of this world. Now we have the opportunity to come down to earth again. The “green” season, if I may call it that, is a reminder that our Christian life has to be rooted in this world. If, metaphorically speaking, we always have our heads in the clouds, now is the time to get our feet back on the earth!

Jesus summarised the Ten Commandments of the Old Testament as two: Loving God (Heads in the Clouds) and Loving our Neighbour (feet well grounded on Earth).

The great humanitarian battles with injustice, poverty, starvation, have to be fought in every generation. In our time they are joined by all the issues which come under the “Green” umbrella, Global Warming, Waste Control, Fuel Resources, issues which remind us that we only hold this planet in Trust for the next generation. And in every community in every generation there is the ongoing struggle with right and wrong, a struggle which begins with *me*.

The Heavenly Gardener has been sowing his seeds, now he'll be looking around to see which ones are starting to bear fruit.
